CITY ELECTION-NOVEMBER 3, 2015

The upcoming City Election will be Tuesday, November 3, 2015, between the hours of 7 am and 8 pm. Registered city voters will be voting for seven at-large City Council seats. Information on each of the candidates is posted at www.greenbeltmd.gov.



YOUR VOTING OPTIONS:

1. EARLY VOTING: Any qualified registered voter will again have the opportunity to vote early or absentee. Early voting will begin on October 17th according to the schedule below. Voters may vote early at any of these times and locations.

2. ABSENTEE VOTING: Any qualified registered voter can vote absentee for any reason. You may request an absentee ballot from the City Offices, 25 Crescent Road, until noon on Monday, November 2. The form to request an absentee ballot is also available at www.greenbeltmd.gov.

3. ON ELECTION DAY AT THE POLLS: You can vote at your polling location, listed on page 2, on Tuesday, November 3 from 7 am - 8 pm.

Plastic Bags and Plastic Film are no longer accepted for curbside recycling. They can be recycled by taking them to grocery stores or other stores that accept them.
