





#### Week Ending February 23

Teresa Smithson attended a meeting of the Parent Child Interaction Therapy (PCIT) Learning Collaborative, at the Institute for Innovation and Implementation of the UMB School of Social Work, on Monday, February 12. The meeting addressed increasing PCIT referrals to participating agencies, and certification support for PCIT trainees.

Teresa Smithson gave a presentation to the Public Safety Advisory Committee meeting on February 6 on Opioid Overdose Prevention and Overdose Response with naloxone. Teresa will be providing voluntary Overdose Response Program training under the supervision of the Prince George's County Health Department for interested Greenbelt residents and city staff.

Liz Park met with an Eleanor Roosevelt High School guidance counselor and ESOL Coordinator to discuss needs of this population and the need for a bilingual CARES counselor.

On Wednesday, February 21, J. Rose Marghi, RN, LCMFT, completed an 8 week grief group for students at Eleanor Roosevelt High School. It was very well received.
