

City Manager's Report Week Ending April 27, 2018

1. Called WSSC's General Manager's office on Tuesday afternoon in follow-up to a call received the same afternoon from Bob Davis of the Greenbelt Co-op and Pharmacy regarding the waterline supplying the Co-op's building's fire suppression system. I have also been in contact with Public Works Director, Jim Sterling, who shared history, as well as the code enforcement supervisor, the city solicitor, and other staff. I have asked the solicitor to serve as contact if necessary as both Assistant City Manager David Moran and myself are members, as are many Council and community members. A letter was drafted and 'electronically signed' by the Mayor requesting WSSC action on the Roosevelt Center project (included separately).
2. Reviewing health insurance proposals received from Ms. Mary Johnson, Human Resources Director.
3. Thank you again to all administrative professionals who help make Greenbelt wonderful!
4. Held a walk-through of Springhill Lake Recreation Center and discussed logistics with ULI staff, along with Ms. Anne Marie Belton and Mr. Joe McNeal. As discussed during the Four Cities meeting, a draft briefing book is being prepared for the panel that ULI is assembling. A draft list of stakeholders is provided under separate cover. Space is limited and the aim is a brief yet productive session with a limited number of stakeholders since ULI panels only have a short period of time. We will be working on meals for the panel, as well as bus transportation for the tour and travel to and from Springhill Lake to the evening meal at a local restaurant.
5. City participation in the state mosquito control program continues to be considered by advisory boards. Mr. Sterling reports that other communities are notifying the program if those governments will participate in the program. Greenbelt may move up quickly from on the wait list of communities that expressed interest in participating. The state has been asked about exploring municipalities' participation without spraying.
6. Mr. Sterling reported that a meeting is needed among the advisory board members to finalize the Sustainable Land Care policy.
7. Included separately is the Friends of the Greenbelt Theatre's March financial report.

8. Attached is correspondence from the County DPWT regarding the city's request to replace the Greenbelt Connection van. The City will investigate the grant program referenced.
9. Attended the Four Cities and Council Meetings.
10. Attended Greenbelt Rotary Club Meeting.
11. Serving on Greenbelt Rotary Club fundraiser committee for the Wine Gala.


Dear Mayor Jordan:

Thank you for your letter dated February 16, 2018 to the County Executive requesting a replacement vehicle under the Statewide Transportation Assistance Program (SSTAP). We understand your vehicle was deemed a total loss and the City desires to use the proceeds from the insurance settlement to obtain a salvage title and repair the vehicle. Per the maintenance agreement, any proceeds from insurance settlements are to be returned to the county. We wish to assist and are willing to allow the City to use the settlement to repair the vehicle. However, as the vehicle was purchased with SSTAP grant funds, concurrence is required from the Maryland Transit Administration (MTA). We have requested concurrence and hope to have a decision shortly.





Dear County Executive Baker:

On behalf of the Greenbelt City Council, I am writing to request funding for replacement of the City's 12 fixed seat lift equipped van. This van is used to provide a call-a-ride transportation service for seniors and physically challenged residents. Unfortunately, the City's only van caught fire in July, 2017 and was declared a total loss. Since then, the City has been in contact with DPWT regarding replacement of this vehicle.

The City obtained the lift-equipped van in 2011 through a Prince George's County cost sharing program utilizing Maryland Statewide Special Transportation Assistance Program (SSTAP) grant funding. For many years, municipalities have partnered with the County and used these funds to obtain these vehicles and provide this critical service to some of our most vulnerable residents.

It is the City's understanding that the County has decided to use these SSTAP funds for other transportation priorities. As a result, this funding source is no longer available to municipalities for the purchase of these specialized and costly vehicles. Greenbelt's need to replace this bus is critical and it is needed now.

We implore you to provide funds through SSTAP or another source to replace this van so Greenbelt can continue to provide this important service.





Apartments: GDC Parkway Apartments were annually inspected.


Rental Property: Ten rentals were annually inspected; and Nineteen rentals were re-inspected.




