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

7. Included separately in your packet is the Summer Camp Registration Report.



Police Chief Search Update, June 1, 2018

The process for the police chief search is the same as detailed in the City's agreement approved by City Council in March. Following the recruiter's discussion with Council, members of the Fraternal Order of Police, the acting police chief, a non-sworn staff police member and other City staff, as well as a tour of Greenbelt, the recruiter developed a recruitment brochure. The brochure was reviewed by City Council and the President of the Fraternal Order of Police before being posted with the advertisement of the position. The position had been posted on the Springsted/Waters website immediately following the approval of the City/firm contract. The brochure was posted along with the advertisement, about two weeks behind the original schedule in order to allow for Council to review and comment on the brochure.

As previously reported to Council, the recruiter posted the brochure and advertisement on Springsted/Water's site for a minimum of four weeks, yet the position remains posted in various locations. For example, the position is posted with the Maryland Police Chief's Association, the International Association of Chiefs of Police (IACP), National Black Law Enforcement Executives (NOBLE) and other organizations reaching people of color and women police executives. As noted during the May 14, 2018 Council meeting, while the deadline for applications was May 21, 2018, the recruitment is open until filled.


Springsted/Waters had received applications on May 21st. The recruiter screened applications received by that date and selected fifteen candidates to progress in consideration. The fifteen candidates selected to move forward in the process were tasked with returning questionnaire responses to the recruiter by May 29, 2018. The recruiter will screen those responses for additional evaluation. The selected candidates were also tasked to participate in an additional screening activity via video that City Council, a Fraternal Order of Police representative, and select City staff will review within the next week. Participants will sign confidentiality agreements regarding the information contained within the applications.

Based on the recruiter's recommendations as well as City Council and FOP feedback, I will work with the recruiter to identify finalists to participate in an assessment center in Greenbelt. Again, staff needs to know Council availability to confirm the public meet and greet reception dates to meet with finalists in mid-to end of June as June 12-13th is not available for Council. The public meet and greet reception will be held during the assessment center in Greenbelt.

The Human Resources Department is contacting technical experts, community members, the Fraternal Order of Police, and City staff to participate in the assessment center. The panels will be representative of Greenbelt's demographics and will include employees at all levels of the organization. Again, all panelists will sign confidentiality agreements. Please note that unlike other jobs, the exact names of the expert assessors will not be known until the semifinalists are known. During police chief searches, potential assessors identify potential conflicts of interest due to assessor's potential relationships with candidates.

The goal continues to be to make an offer of employment to the successful chief finalist in June 2018.

Activities will include a performance by Beech Tree Puppets (3pm), a studio open house and sale (1-4pm), a closing reception for Anna Fine Foer's exhibit in the art gallery (1-3pm), and a "Birds Gone Wild" collaborative art workshop with Rachel Cross (1-3pm) in which participants will learn about local ecology while painting "photo stand-ins" for display at future Greenbelt Recreation events.
- Staff prepared contracts and other materials for the eight artists who have been selected to participate in the Greenbelt Community Center's Artist in Residence Program in FY19. Preparations for the new residency year include scheduling of all community engagement projects and studio open houses, and updating of their web presence.
- Attended a FONDCA board meeting.
