RESOLUTION NUMBER 1057

A RESOLUTION TO NEGOTIATE THE PURCHASE AND INSTALLATION OF A SECURITY GATE, ACCESS CONTROL SYSTEM, AND FENCING AT THE GREENBELT POLICE STATION BY LONG FENCE OF CAPITOL HEIGHTS, MARYLAND, AT A COST OF \$23,058

---

WHEREAS, the Greenbelt City Council approved a Capital Project in the amount of \$45,000 for improvements at the Greenbelt Police Station to include upgrades to perimeter security; and

WHEREAS, the scope of work was defined to include installation of a security gate at the driveway entrance to the rear parking lot at the police station, with an access control system, as well as installation of a fence and gate separating the animal control facility from the police parking lot and a pedestrian access gate to the animal control facility from the sidewalk on Ridge Road; and

WHEREAS, five fencing security gate installers were contacted to obtain quotes for the prescribed work; and

WHEREAS, Long Fence of Capitol Heights quoted a price of \$23,058 for the prescribed work and indicated that they were able to perform all of the required services in a timely fashion; and

WHEREAS, Long Fence of Capitol Heights was the original installer of the fencing at the police station, and also installed the security gate system at the Public Works Department, and had also completed other projects for the city including fencing for the dog park, phases I and II; and

WHEREAS, Long Fence of Capitol Heights is known to the city as a reputable, competent and reliable vendor which has performed other projects for the city of high quality and reasonable price; and

WHEREAS, it was determined by staff that Long Fence of Capitol Heights provided the lowest and best price for the specified project; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED that the proposal for the installation of a security gate, access control system and fencing at the rear parking lot of the Greenbelt Police Station be approved for Long Fence of Capitol Heights in the total amount of \$23,058 pursuant to their written proposal of May 29, 2009.

PASSED by the Council of the City of Greenbelt, Maryland, at its regular meeting of January 11, 2010.
