

City Manager's Report Week Ending January 5, 2018

1. In response to a request for information for a *News Review* article submitted to the Police Department, I declined authorizing use of Greenbelt Lake's ice. Staff indicated that the City Code states the City Manager can allow use. I have directed that given weather conditions, referrals be made to nearby skating rinks or other recreation areas that have designated, tested safe areas and people or resources dedicated to monitoring for emergencies and safety.
2. Community Planner, Senior Inspector and Director of Planning interviews are anticipated within the next few weeks.
3. Addressed matters with City Solicitor Karen Ruff and outside legal counselors on operational, legal matters. Public Information Coordinator Beverly Palau, Acting Planning Director Terri Hruby, and Information Technology Director Dale Worley are in contact with outside counsel regarding cell towers in Greenbelt.
4. Staff continues to seek access to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development online computer systems. Recertification and updates have been a perennial challenge given federal processes. Under the circumstances, the City's HUD representative is helping the City navigate and address deadlines. This will allow staff to issue payment from past award for Green Ridge House and apply for future funding.
5. Met with the Chief of Prince George's County Animal Control and Mayor Jordan.
6. Corresponded with a representative of Delegate Washington's Office.
7. Scheduled to meet with City Treasurer Jeff Williams and representatives of Alexander & Cleaver to negotiate during the week of January 8, 2018.
8. Staff is monitoring reports of water in the road due to drainage (Brett/Megan area) and a main break near 45 Ridge, among other normal operations. WSSC is aware of the later.
9. Please forward any concerns to the updated ULI-TAP document that was provided to Council via packet in December. This included a recommendation to amend the scope of the study area further into College Park. No comment was received. Staff is scheduled to meet with ULI, College Park, and Berwyn Heights next week.

11. Prepared for work session on January 3 regular meeting on January 8.






The following items highlight the various activities of the staff of Planning and Community Development for the past week.

- Youth Center hosts the first Contra Dance of 2018 this Saturday. Beginner lessons are offered at 6:30 pm. Come dance to the music of Transatlantic Crossing from 7:00pm-9:45pm.

AQUATIC AND FITNESS CENTER:

- Due to inclement weather, GAFC opened at 10:30 am on Thursday and Friday.
- GAFC Swim Instructor(s) provided seven private swim lessons (Friday-Thursday).
- Three private swim lesson requests were received and entered into the database for swim instructor(s) match. Eight requests have been matched with Swim Instructors (Friday-Thursday).
- GMST Winter 2018 registration is on-going. The Open House is scheduled for Tuesday, January 23, with the first practice on Thursday, January 25.
- GAFC is offering a Lifeguarding class on Sundays only from 9 am to 5 pm, January 7 - January 28. Lifeguarding Pre-Test is ongoing now.
- Aqua Zumba Saturday session starts on January 6 from 12:30 pm to 1:15 pm. Drop-in only.
- Winter 2018 session of Home School Swim Lessons starts January 5. Children's Swim Lessons start on January 6.

ARTS:

- The Art Gallery exhibit Elemental Motion - Digital Photography by Peter Iverson and Julie Simon closed this week. The show was greatly enjoyed by visitors, whose comments included: "Simply beautiful!"; "glorious!"; "Ethereal!"; "I can't believe it is not painting"; "Very original"; "Stunning!"; "beautifully curated"; "Thought - or imagination - provoking"; "Some look inspired by Northern Lights - gorgeous".

This show will feature costumes, props, sets and production photography from ten shows which have been mounted in the last two years. The show will run from January 15 to March 23.
- Some winter session classes began and registration is ongoing. Staff are also supporting the production needs of the Greenbelt Youth Musical which began regular rehearsals this week.

COMMUNITY CENTER:

- There is currently one Center Leader shift open on the permanent schedule. Recruitment continues.
- Gym floor resurfacing continued. The completion has been delayed, but it will reopen on January 7.
- The Adult Care installed an exhibit in the front lobby display case. Check it out!
- Staff continued research and training for the impending RecTrac 3.1 migration.
- Reports were run in preparation for the shut down for the RecTrac 3.1 migration.
- Supervisor continued to field inquiries in regard to food operation rentals for the Commercial Kitchen. There have been 273 inquiries since April 2015. There are currently three food operations who received all permits and may rent the Kitchen.
- There were 4 facility reservations processed.
- There were 0 private rentals and 6 pattern rentals.
