

The following items highlight the various activities of the staff of Planning and Community Development for the past week.

CODE ENFORCEMENT

Commercial Properties: Several office suites in Hanover Office Park were annually inspected; and
7475 Greenbelt Road – PetSmart was re-inspected.

Apartments: Parkway Garden apartments were re-inspected.

Rental Property: Thirteen rentals were annually inspected; and
Two rentals were re-inspected.

Complaints: Five complaints were logged regarding no heat, water coming into basement from next door neighbor, trash not being placed in receptacles, possible unlicensed rental, missing building door, broken exit sign, hole in ceiling and water damage from a possible water leak.
