FLEET MAINTENANCE

- There is currently one Center Leader shift open on the permanent schedule. Recruitment continues.
- Supervisor conducted three tours for potential food operations to rent the Kitchen.
- Supervisor continues to field inquiries in regard to food operation rentals for the Commercial Kitchen. There have been 293 inquiries since April 2015. There are currently five food operations who received all permits and may rent the Kitchen.
- The facility hosted an American Red Cross Blood Drive.
- There were 5 facility reservations processed.
- There were 3 private rentals and 14 pattern rentals.

ARTS



During the month of February, 14 families on average were seen for counseling at CARES. Sixty individuals on average came on a weekly basis among whom 21 were 18 years of age and younger. The CICs (Crisis Intervention Counselors) saw eight clients.

Liz Park and Darren Stephenson attended the State Advisory Group for Juvenile Justice on Monday. The group heard reports from two programs receiving grant funds and reviewed the group's draft 3 year plan proposal.
