

## City Manager's Report Week Ending May 11, 2018

1. Received Principal McNeill's approval of the invoice for City reimbursement for FY2018 school resource officer services. The approved invoice will be submitted to the County for reimbursement. Attached is the FY2018 agreement. The agreement will be signed and submitted to the County.
2. Awaiting confirmation of the reopening of the Greenbelt Aquatic and Fitness Center. Mr. Sterling reports that rooftop units will be set by Wednesday. The space will be assessed for a few days afterward to determine a re-opening date.
3. Meeting with staff and counsel regarding personnel and operational matters.
4. Recreation and Police Departments are investigating recent theft at the Greenbelt Aquatic and Fitness Center. Patrons will be asked to secure their belongings. Signs with similar messages will be installed. Both departments are working together to prevent future incidents.
5. The Solicitor received the WMATA draft agreement a week ago. Staff is researching potential grant funding identified by Council. The application is lengthy with a short turn-around time. Completion of an application may not be feasible. Staff is checking into Federal procurement components and confirming whether Woodlawn and WMATA have issues with participation.
6. Nearing completion of the Council Chambers Audio/Visual Upgrade. Ms. Beverly Palau reports that the contractor spent most of the week integrating the City's channels (Comcast 71, Comcast HD 996, Verizon 21, and Streaming) with the new system. This required work working with many different systems and formats. The contractor completed the integration, then fine-tuned and integrated the sound systems. Staff anticipates live sessions on Monday and Tuesday of next week. Additional podium programming will take place next week. The monitor that goes on the wall behind the City Council will be installed when it arrives. In addition, staff will also select new window treatments next week.
7. Ms. Mary Johnson and Ms. Julie Magness report that as of the date of today's report, 130 (out of 168) of the classified employees have participated in the Anti-Harassment Training. Recreation will participate in the training as part of an upcoming Recreation training session. The Human Resources will continue to follow up with directors and employees who have not yet completed the training.

8. Participated in the ULI-TAP telephone meeting along with Ms. Terri Hruby and Ms. Anne Marie Belton. Thank you to both for their work on preparation of briefing materials and invitations.
