

## City Manager's Report Week Ending November 2, 2018

1. Attached is the update referenced regarding the County Zoning Re-write.
2. Attached is the Police Department's September 2018 Statistical Report.
3. Thank you to staff who supported the Family Fun Night and Halloween Movie Activities at Springhill Lake Recreation Center- Recreation, Public Works, Public Information, Animal Control and Police entertained participants with candy, "tricked out" vehicles, and pumpkins.
4. Thanks also to everyone who staffed the Costume Parade and helped prep for the Northway Pumpkin walk.
5. Please note that Washington Area Bicyclists Association's (WABA) annual Cider Run will include Greenbelt's Buddy Attick Park as a pit stop. Please be alert for bicyclists in the area all day.
6. Participated in teleconference with developer, bond counsel, financial consultant and staff on the Greenbelt Station Tax Increment Financing (TIF). The schedule for project is being confirmed and will be distributed to Council. At this time, parties agree that Davenport will issue the Request for Proposals to financial institutions the week of November 12, 2018. If all goes as planned, including review of RFP responses, an appraisal, a market study, and the financing should close by January 2019.
7. Signed the Maryland Heritage Areas Authority grant agreement. The grant provides funding for: Assessment, cleaning, repair and development of a treatment plan for the Mother and Child statue; repair of the "Preamble Friezes" at the Community Center (what people refer to as the Bas Reliefs); painting of the Community Center windows' and development and fabrication of interpretive panel near the Mother and Child statue.
8. Conducted interviews for the Economic Development Coordinator position.
9. Working with Human Resources to finalize the brochure and advertisement for the Recreation Director recruitment.
10. Met and/or corresponded with staff and legal counsel regarding personnel, legal, and operational matters.
11. Corresponded with business and community stakeholders.
12. Attended the Creative Placemaking workshop at the University of Maryland's School of Architecture along with Ms. Nicole DeWald, Public Art Manager. One of the speakers discussed

the non-profit Dance Exchange's efforts to support community planning for a Takoma Park transportation project.

13. Attended the Costume Parade and Halloween Fun Night.

14. Attended the memorial service regarding the Pittsburgh tragedy,

15. Attended the City Council Work Sessions on Green Ridge House Admissions and the Crowne Plaza hotel's upcoming renovation.

### UPDATE!!!

#### Prince George's County Re-write

On October 23, 2018, the Prince George's County Council adopted the legislative packet to re-write the Prince George's County Zoning Ordinance and Subdivision regulations. This marks the first time in 50 years the County's zoning ordinance has been re-written. Over the next 18 months the County will be working on a comprehensive Countywide Map Amendment process which is needed to implement the zones in the new zoning ordinance. There will be opportunity during the Comprehensive Map Amendment process for public input, and the City planning staff will be actively engaged in the process as new Zones are identified for Greenbelt.

#### Neighborhood Conservation Overlay (N-C-O) Zone

On October 23, 2018, immediately following the adoption of the zoning re-write legislative packet, the Prince George's County Council unanimously passed a resolution (CR-82-2018), approving the initiation and preparation by the Prince George's County Planning Board of a new N-C-O Zone for Greenbelt. Greenbelt Homes, Incorporated (GHI) has a Zoning Task Force that has been working hard on drafting an N-C-O Zone for GHI. It is anticipated that over the next 18 months Maryland – National Capital Park and Planning Staff, the City of Greenbelt, GHI and other property owners within Historic Greenbelt will be engaged in a planning process to prepare an N-C-O Zone for Greenbelt. The goal is to have a Greenbelt N-C-O Zone completed in time to be adopted concurrently with the comprehensive Countywide Map Amendment.






#### Week Ending November 2
