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

City Manager's Report Week Ending March 17, 2017

1. Staff met with the representatives of the Zero Waste Subgroup regarding the petition to place additional composting units in Greenbelt using County grant funding. Tentative locations include Springhill Lake Recreation Center grounds and the loading dock of the New Deal Café. This includes Planning (Ms. Celia Craze), Recreation (Mr. Joe McNeal), Public Works (Mr. Jim Sterling and Ms. Erin Josephitis), and City Manager's Office (Mr. David Moran and Ms. Nicole Ard).
2. City staff responded to Mr. Bill Orleans' petition request by sending via certified mail previous correspondence provided to Mr. Orleans.
3. City staff responded to the request by Mr. Bill Hartman concerning the needs of a visually-impaired advisory board member requiring a Braille printer. The volunteer declined special accommodation.
4. Met with Recreation staff during a series of meetings on division budgets.
5. Met with Ms. Christal Batey, Mr. Jeff Williams, and Green Ridge House management representatives (Mr. Steve Seh, Ms. Kim Potts), regarding the Green Ridge House budget. Staff will monitor the potential discontinuation of Federal funds following the pay off of the HUD mortgage in November. There is uncertainty surrounding the long-term availability of various HUD funding, including the rental subsidies and maintenance reimbursement.
6. Met with Ms. Christal Batey and Ms. Liz Parks regarding recent trends at Green Ridge House.
7. In follow-up to my previous meeting a few weeks ago, met with representatives of Morning Calm (the new owners of the Capitol Office Park), Ms. Celia Craze, and Mr. Jim Sterling regarding the Morning Calm's experience thus far in Greenbelt. Morning Calm is conducting interior and exterior repairs and renovations. The firm is also offering a shuttle service to the Greenbelt Metro Station.
8. Four Cities have been approached by College Park to purchase a new street sweeper, with College Park taking the lead in developing a new schedule. The estimated cost will be included in the budget.
9. Monitored staff work and regional conference calls during inclement weather. Thank you to Public Works, Public Information, and Police employees who worked through the recent ice and snow storm!

10. Coordinated with Human Resources Director Mary Johnson, City Solicitor John Shay and directors regarding personnel matters.
11. Coordinated with Ms. Celia Craze and Mr. Shay regarding an appeal to a code enforcement complaint on Hanover Parkway.
12. Met with GHI representatives (Mr. Eldon Ralph, Mr. Stefan Brodd, and Mr. Steve Skolnik) regarding GHI, issues and feedback on City services. I received the request to renew the playground agreement. We are confirming the language and if this will be placed on a City Council agenda.
13. Received a draft renewal lease for the Greenbelt Arts Center. I have requested review by the City Solicitor and confirmation on the need for City Council approval on a future agenda.
14. Scheduled to meet with Greenbelt Theatre (Dr. Caitlin McGrath) on Friday, March 17th. Pepco is scheduled to come to the March 22 work session to share information on the rate structure and definition assigned to the Theatre.
15. A Meet and Greet reception for the City Manager has been scheduled for March 21, 2017, 7pm at Franklin Park.
16. 31 RSVPs have been received for the March 29 Business Coffee. The Coffee is scheduled for 7:45am, in the Council Chambers. Lt. Governor Boyd Rutherford is the guest speaker.
17. Mr. McLaughlin has raised the question of continued participation in Playful City USA. Considerable staff time is required to prepare annual grant applications, however recent grants have not been awarded to the City since the City first participated in the program eight years ago. Continued participation will be posed to staff and City Council.
18. The City Clerk and Administrative Assistant attended the quarterly Maryland Municipal Clerks Association meeting and training session on Thursday.
19. The City Clerk coordinated the advisory group training session *Conducting and Participating in Effective Meetings* held Thursday evening. Thirteen advisory group members from the following boards/committees were in attendance: Advisory Committee on Trees, Advisory Planning Board, Community Relations Advisory Board, Employee Relations Board, Ethics Commission, Forest Preserve Advisory Board, Public Safety Advisory Committee, Senior Citizens Advisory Committee and Youth Advisory Committee.

Permits: Twenty-one permits were approved and issued.


