### **ADMINISTRATION**

- Jim Sterling and Terri Hruby met with WSSC regarding the 20-inch water main relocation at the water tower on Lastner Lane.

- Attended the Labor Day Festival Committee meeting.
- Our Fall 2017 Activity Guide is available online and in Recreation Centers. Fall Registration for residents began on August 21; non-residents may register beginning August 28.
- Park Rangers will be visiting Greenbelts' parks this weekend, informing our patrons about park rules and assisting with programs.
- Mom's Morning Out registration continues this week in anticipation for the Fall 2017 pre-school program.
- Preparation of Maryland State Department of Education, Office of Child Care application for a Continuing License for our pre-school program "Mom's Morning Out" continues this week.
- Plans for Special Events continued this week with a focus on Labor Day Weekend and our Fall Bike Rodeo, scheduled for Saturday, September 23.

### **AQUATIC AND FITNESS CENTER:**

- Front Desk staff conducted end of summer meeting in preparation for Fall schedule.


### **ARTS:**

- A new exhibition is being installed this week at the Greenbelt Community Center Art Gallery – Superblocks: A Drawing Installation by Amanda Burnham. Presented in celebration of Greenbelt's 80th anniversary, this show is inspired by the city's history and built environment. It will remain on view through October 27.
- Summer quarterly classes have ended. The studios are being prepared for Greenbelt Labor Day Festival activities and the start of fall classes. Postcards are being distributed at area libraries and businesses to promote fall class offerings.
- Staff provided a studio tour to another prospective Artist in Residence Program applicant. One studio is currently vacant and applications are being accepted on a rolling basis until the space is filled.
- Ongoing activities include: receipt and processing of Festival of Lights Art and Craft Fair applications; artist studio visits; program development and marketing.

### **Community Center:**

- Circus Camp presented the Session VI Summer Circus Show (final show of summer!). It was a showcase of circus acts and skills, performed by 24 campers, under the direction of former Ringling Bros. performer Gregory May.
- A fire drill was conducted to fulfill camp requirements.

- Registration for residents and SAGE classes began on Monday. There was a steady flow of patrons through the Main Office.
- Preparations continue for Labor Day weekend.
- Supervisor participated in a Maryland Recreation and Parks Association Leadership Institute conference call.
- A replacement projection screen was installed in room 201. Its predecessor had spring issues.
- Supervisor continues to field inquiries in regard to food operation rentals for the Commercial Kitchen. There have been 238 inquiries since April 2015. There are currently seven food operations who received all permits and may rent the Kitchen.
- The facility hosted an American Red Cross Blood Drive.
- There were 5 facility reservations processed.
- There was 1 private rental and 8 pattern rentals.
- The following groups received free space: Golden Age Club, Greenbelt Labor Day Committee, Real Men Care, Inc., Girl Scout Troop #27
- There was one no show for a free space group.






