



The GAIL Team hosted a meeting with Congressman Steny Hoyer at the City of Bowie Senior Center to present the Dementia Friendly Prince George's County Initiative on Tuesday, August 15.

Christal Batey presented to the Prince George's County Senior Provider Network about Dementia Friendly Businesses and how they can become involved in the movement.
