

1. The latest edition of the City Bulletin is being delivered to the community. Councilmembers should receive a copy at home soon.
2. Correspondence was submitted to WMATA staff requesting alternatives to the staff comments presented for City consideration on the trail. This includes a revised confidential draft legal agreement.
3. Participated in a conference call with Senator Cardin's staff, Mayor Jordan and Ms. Terri Hruby regarding grants for construction of the WMATA Trail.
4. Included separate from this packet is confidential correspondence.
5. Conducting budget meetings with departments on year-end and first quarter fiscal year activities. This included discussion of service trends, programs, and budget variances.






Week Ending October 13

- Modelled on our successful Artward Bound workshop series for youth, staff have developed a menu of Art Social activities that can be booked by groups of adults. Additional arts education programs in development include a possible workshop series at the Doctor's Hospital rehabilitation center.
- Currently on view at the Greenbelt Community Center Art Gallery – Superblocks: A Drawing Installation by Amanda Burnham. Presented as part of the Greenbelt Legacy 80th anniversary celebration, this exhibit will continue through October 27. Preparations are underway for the next exhibition which will feature abstract digital photography by Peter Iverson and Julie Simon.
- Visited about 60 studios last weekend, scouting for artists for Greenbelt Community Center gallery exhibitions and offering continued support to those who have shown with us previously.
- Attended the annual Advisory Board Banquet and the Cultural Arts Showcase sponsored by the Howard County Arts Council.
- Congratulations are extended to Greenbelt Pottery Group on the success of their bi-annual Empty Bowls fundraiser. Coordinated in partnership with the Greenbelt Community Church and the Mishkan Torah Synagogue, the event raised over \$4,000 for Help By Phone which operates food pantries in Prince George's County. Greenbelt Pottery Group is planning to install a new hallway exhibit at the Community Center in November and host a potters' swap meet (for tools and materials) on November 5.
