

## City Manager's Report Week Ending January 22, 2016

1. Storm Prep! Storm Prep! Storm Prep!
2. The GHI Board approved the sale of 10-A to the City at its meeting Thursday night. The Board acted swiftly and positively! This information will not be referenced in the Council meeting packet as the meeting packets are completed.
3. Attached is a press release about a company named "X-energy" which has received a Department of Energy grant. X-energy is led by Dr. Kam Ghaffarian, who also heads SGT, Inc., a large NASA contractor. Both firms are located in the Commerce Center building at the corner of Greenbelt Road and Hanover Parkway.
4. Included in Council's packet is the report from the Public Service Commission of Maryland on the double pole issue (referred to as "Utility Pole Attachments"). Greenbelt's concern about the issue is mentioned in the report. The recommendation is that the State join a national web-based notification system to keep all parties informed. The report also notes that affected utilities entered into agreements with time limits on the removal. I would look for Delegate Tarlau's response on this matter. The good news is nearly all double poles in the public ROW of Greenbelt have been removed.

# X-energy Wins Department of Energy Development Grant

DOE awards 5-year, \$40MM funding grant for the development of Xe-100 advanced reactor concept

GREENBELT, Md., Jan. 15, 2016 /PRNewswire/ -- The U.S. Department of Energy announced that X-energy has won a \$40 million grant to develop the Xe-100 pebble bed High Temperature Gas-Cooled reactor (HTGR). The development grant includes \$6MM in FY16, which will be supplemented with additional investor funding from X-energy.

Today, we have taken a giant step towards that dream. I am incredibly proud of the X-energy team, and we look forward to a productive collaboration with the Department of Energy."

We are thrilled that the DOE recognizes the Xe-100's advantages: a clean, affordable, secure design with electrical generation and industrial process steam capabilities. The funding focuses on targeted technology development, including core modeling, fuel fabrication, and Nuclear Regulatory Commission outreach. X-energy's team includes BWXT, Teledyne Brown Engineering, SGL Group, Oregon State University, Idaho National Laboratory, and Oak Ridge National Laboratory.

DOE's previous investment in TRISO fuel and advanced reactor concepts, combined with this award, are a game changer in accelerating the deployment of safe, clean energy in the United States."

**About X-energy:** X-energy is dedicated to developing transformational energy solutions through the application of innovative nuclear technology. X-energy is designing the Xe-100, an advanced nuclear reactor that will expand nuclear power into new markets in increments of approximately 50MWe. The Xe-100 is a small and simple design that requires less time to construct, with factory-produced components, and will be "walk-away" safe without operator intervention during loss of coolant conditions. X-energy is based in Greenbelt, Maryland.





### Greenbelt CARES

Week Ending January 22



During the month of December, nine (9) families on average were seen for counseling at CARES. Sixty-six (66) individuals on average came on a weekly basis among whom twenty-three (23) were 18 years of age and younger. The CICs (Crisis Intervention Counselors) saw three clients.

Darren Stephenson spoke for a Life Skills/Mentoring Program at the Capital Sportsplex in Glenn Dale. This program combines a Sports Training Program with mentoring and works with 3, 4 and 5 star high school football athletes. This program's mission is to provide mentoring, coaching and local outreach to high school age youths with emphasis on decision making and critical life skills development as it relates to their passion for the game of football. Darren presented information on Anger Management and Conflict Resolution to approximately 50 student-athletes, 10 coaches and 20 parents in attendance. The program leader, Coach Searcy, agreed to collaborate on future activities with Greenbelt CARES.

Liz Park attended the Maryland Juvenile Justice State Advisory Group meeting on January 11. The group heard a presentation from the Department of Juvenile Service's new department on Family Engagement.

Judye Hering is pleased to introduce Kristen Cabrera, a graduating senior from the University of Maryland. Kristen has chosen CARES' Vocational/ Educational Program as her internship experience for the 2016 winter/spring semester.

Teresa Smithson completed 30 hours of SMART Recovery group Facilitator training during the months of December and January. SMART Recovery/ Self Management for Addiction Recovery is self-empowering, scientifically based recovery support group. CARES plans to start a group in Greenbelt, with Teresa acting as start-up facilitator.

CARES hosted two (2) trainings of the Darkness to Light, Stewards of Children program. One training was for City staff and one was for community members. The training program aims to empower adults to prevent, recognize and react responsibly to child sexual abuse.

Liz Park attended a briefing to the House Appropriations Committee by the Governor's Office for Children (GOC) on their FY17 Strategic Plan.


Judye Hering held registration for the winter session of the GED program on Tuesday and Wednesday. The program continues to be held in two locations: the Municipal Building (Monday and Wednesday morning) and the Springhill Lake Recreation Center Clubhouse (Tuesday and Thursday morning). Students use the computer and practice their math, English literature and grammar, social studies and science skills. Nine (9) students registered for the program.

Judye Hering began a new afterschool tutoring program on Tuesday. This drop-in program is for students who would like additional help and assistance with their homework or academic skills. The program is held at the Springhill Lake Recreation Center Clubhouse every Tuesday and Thursday, from 3:00 – 5:00. The goal of this program is to fulfill the academic needs of students living in the Franklin Park community and provide additional assistance to those students already attending the Saturday morning tutoring program.

### **HORTICULTURE/PARKS**


- Collected discarded Christmas trees at appointed areas throughout the city.

- Attended, via phone, the Built Environment and Energy Advisory Committee (BEEAC) COG meeting.



The FY17 application was put online thanks to Beverly Palau. Applications are to be completed online and are due by March 4th.
- Met with City Manager and Public Works Director to review Community Center HVAC improvement project.
- Met with City Manager for preliminary review of department budget.
