

City Manager's Report Week Ending March 18, 2016

1. Budget – budget – budget!
2. Attached is the Police Department's monthly statistical report for February 2016. It includes the breakdown of Greenbelt East residential and commercial.
3. Included in Council's packet is the annual report of the County/municipal I-Net. Kudos to Beverly for her outstanding work (again!) on this document.
4. As part of budget considerations, Mary Johnson, Human Resources Director, explored ways to limit health insurance costs. As mentioned at the pre-budget meeting, indications were an increase of 15 to 19% in cost was anticipated. In the budget, it will be recommended the City stay with CareFirst but switch to a plan which eliminates some co-pays to encourage visits to your doctor and raises deductibles. This plan will lower health costs for both the employee and City by 5-6% from current premiums. Way to go, Mary!
5. Interviewed by Stuart Eisenberg of Hyattsville Community Development Corporation as part of the economic development study they are conducting. A project update is attached.
6. Touched base with Bowie and Hyattsville on County funding for School Resource Officer. The Bowie City Manager is contacting County Council member Turner to learn status now that County budget has been introduced.

Summary:

After an exploration into the capability of the CivicPlus database options and other online mapping tools, we are recommending the purchase of iFreeTool’s online cloud-based database system, which includes the ability for form submissions and embedding, mapping, easy field editing, mass-email, and import-export features. The cost is \$99 a Year (\$8.25 per month) to provide multiple viewing options, including that for the public. We will purchase the first year as a part of our Website Integration portion of the project. The amount will need to be integrated into the annual City budget to upkeep the license. We explored as many free options

as possible, but the ability to customized your database and get the needed mapping options requires a paid license.

We will schedule a meeting with Beverly in late March/early April to talk about website integration.

Based on time allocation, we had discussed 5 public maps, with 2 of them being the Property Database and Business database. The other topics we have discussed are:

- Bike & Pedestrian Trails (based on the current pdf map)
- Public Transit
- Places of Interest (including Schools, Parks, Playgrounds, etc.)
