

City Manager's Report Week Ending July 25, 2014

1. I will be on leave for the next two weeks. David Moran will be Acting City Manager.
2. Mayor Jordan and I attended the department directors meeting at Doctors Hospital which was attended by about 40 senior level Doctors staff. Philip Down, CEO of Doctors, and Paul Grenaldo, COO of Doctors, noted the health service environment is changing from a focus on attracting patients to a focus on keeping people/ the community healthy. This is resulting in the hospital moving towards a more external orientation for its services, rather than the internal view it has historically taken. Mayor Jordan was the first "outside" person to speak to this group. Doctors has long been a partner in the City's health fair and just started sponsoring the Farmers Market. I anticipate more partnering opportunities in the future. Attached is a handout prepared for the event on Greenbelt's Healthy Initiatives.
3. A five question survey has been posted on the City website related to the Economic Development Study. These are the types of questions which Mr. Basu will be raising in the focus groups. Notice of the survey will be in the *City News Review* ad for the next few weeks.



Let's Move! Campaign

- Greenbelt has been designated a Let's Move! City. Let's Move! is a comprehensive initiative, begun by First Lady Michelle Obama, dedicated to solving the challenge of childhood obesity within a generation, so that children born today will grow up healthier and able to pursue their dreams. Combining comprehensive strategies with common sense, Let's Move! is about putting children on the path to a healthy future during their earliest years by providing information and fostering environments that support healthy choices.
- As a result of this designation, the Recreation Department began a program called "Get Active Greenbelt." This program assists people of all ages to lead a more active lifestyle. Programs such as Family Fit Nights, Active Aging Week for seniors, running clubs and fitness classes for all prove to be very popular. Also, a focus was placed on our summer camp program. All camps added a health and wellness class that includes aerobic activities but also explains the health benefits to being more active.

Healthy Eating Active Living (HEAL) Cities & Towns

- Greenbelt was one of 15 Maryland communities named a HEAL City. The HEAL Cities & Towns Campaign provides training and technical assistance to help city officials adopt policies that improve their community's physical activity and retail food environments. Supporting healthy choices is essential to address the obesity epidemic among Maryland's children and adults.
- This campaign has three initiatives: 1) Accessibility to healthy foods; 2) Accessibility to an active lifestyle; and 3) Workplace Wellness. In the next several months, policies will be introduced to achieve these initiatives.

KaBoom! - Playful City USA

- Playful City USA is a national recognition program, sponsored by the Humana Foundation, honoring cities and towns that champion efforts to make play a priority through establishing policy initiatives, infrastructure investments and innovative programming.
- Greenbelt is a charter member of Playful City, having received the designation for the past seven years.

Employee Wellness Program (Be Happy Be Healthy)

- The City of Greenbelt became a member of Healthiest Maryland Businesses in 2011.
- The City recommends that all employees take advantage of the Employee Wellness Program. The title of the program is “Be Happy Be Healthy”. This program offers lunchtime exercise classes free of charge or at a reduced rate for all employees. Activities include yoga, Zumba, volleyball and basketball. Unstructured exercise such as jogging and weight lifting is also encouraged.
- As part of the Be Happy Be Healthy program, employees receive half price membership to the Greenbelt Aquatic and Fitness Center.

Greenbelt Assistance in Living (GAIL) Program

- The goal of this program is to provide information and support services to enable seniors to remain in their homes. GAIL provides information and advocacy to seniors to ensure they can access any support services for which they are eligible. GAIL partners to make available low/ no cost health related services, surplus food and counseling. There is a grant program to enable home modifications such as grab bars or ramps. GAIL was established in 2001 and is available to senior citizens residing in the City and/ or caregivers of a Greenbelt senior.

Employee Health Fair

- The City coordinates a yearly health fair free of charge for community residents, employees and their families. The Health Fair event offers basic health screenings, demonstrations and information to promote healthy living.

FACILITIES MAINTENANCE


- Made plumbing repairs in restrooms at Schrom Hills Park, Community Center and Youth Center.

ADMINISTRATION

- Attended monthly in-service training for aquatics staff.
- Prepared for PRAB sub-committee meeting to begin review of the Lake Park Master Plan. The sub-committee will meet at the Community Center on Wednesday, July 30th at 7 p.m.
- Processed a variety of park and facility permit applications.
- Staff met with Assistant City Manager to review logistics for Council Work Session at the Springhill Lake Recreation Center.
- Director attended the MRPA General Membership Meeting on Wednesday at Conquest Beach.
- Participated in the Let's Move Cities, Towns and Counties (LMCTC) Region 3 Quarterly Call on Monday. The primary focus of the call was to review the Goal 3 changes which are now official, changing focus from adoption of 2 USDA programs to promotion of 4 USDA programs: School Breakfast Program, National School Lunch Program, After School Programs through the Child and Adult Care Food Program and the Summer Service Program.

YOUTH CENTER

- Session 3 of Camp Pine Tree concluded Friday. The highlight of the session was the Camp Pine Tree Variety Show where campers put on a show with a variety of dances and skits. Camp Pine Tree 1 also spent a day learning about firefighters when they visited the Fire Museum of Maryland and even had a "hands-on" tour of the Greenbelt Volunteer Fire Department. Camp Pine Tree 2 spent a hot day watching a baseball game when they took a trip to Prince George's Stadium for a Bowie Baysox game.
