

## City Manager's Report Week Ending May 31, 2019

1. Please find foreclosure (attached) and rental property information (emailed). If a hard copy was requested, the documents are physically attached.
2. Attached please find a confidential packet (personnel) containing the resumes of recreation director candidate finalists.
3. Attached is the Memorial Day revenue report from Recreation. Excellent weather boosted total collected revenue compared to the prior two years. The chart measures the weekend sale of daily admissions, annual and summer passes.
4. Also attached is the Police Department's Statistical Report for March 2019.
5. Outstanding work by CARES and GAIL staff on the recent State site visit!
6. Congratulations to Ms. Judith Howerton on earning her American Institute of Certified Planners certification.
7. Congratulations to Code Enforcement Inspector Anthony Crump on earning his certification.
8. Recreation staff is working on some final touches on the outdoor pool's "mushroom" and the beach entry.
9. Over 100 children and youth are expected for Saturday's Bike Rodeo! Another copy of this weekend's Greenbelt Day Weekend events calendar is in your envelope!
10. Staff learned that the M-NCCPC's summer playground program for children and the xtreme teen program have been displaced from Springhill Lake Elementary School and Greenbelt Middle School. There will be remodeling at Springhill Lake and a special summer program at the Middle School. Recognizing the impact on Greenbelt West youth and limited capacity at Springhill Lake Recreation Center, Recreation has inquired about the alternative use of Dora Kennedy French Immersion School.
11. Regarding the concerns noted by Councilmembers Roberts and Putens, Chief Bowers reports that police will be patrolling both Buddy Attick Lake Park and Schrom Park this weekend. Police and Recreation Park Rangers will be working closely to help visitors understand rules and enjoy the parks. In addition, Mr. Joe McNeal reports that all Park Rangers will undergo additional training to support the collaboration. Visitors should call the police if they see anything of concern.
12. The tree at Crescent Road was removed. The removal of the tree at the Youth Center is on hold for safety reasons until the surrounding ground dries.
13. In response to Council member Byrd's request, the expansion of WI-FI in the Aquatic and Fitness Center is slated to be complete within a few weeks. Regarding existing service, WI-FI is available in Springhill Lake's Clubhouse and the Computer Lab. Staff is not certain of the range beyond the Lab. As noted previously, WI-FI was expanded on the lower level of the Community Center last year,

complementing service available in the 2<sup>nd</sup> Floor Multi-Purpose Room. Staff has no current plans for the Youth Center but has expressed interest in the future.

14. Met with and/or corresponded with staff and legal counsel regarding personnel and operational matters. The meeting with the solicitor regarding the mobile billboards was cancelled yet he had confirmed that planning staff's recommendation will be followed. This information is attached in a confidential packet.
15. Code Enforcement Supervisor Gil Cabrera reports that the owner of Roosevelt Center complied with roof repair of the roof leak at 109 Centerway (real estate agency) and 113 Centerway (café).
16. Staff identified and resolved a website software quirk that delayed receipt of public meeting requests (about three private events, all have since been approved).
17. Please note that staff became aware of an on-going issue at 127 Greenhill as property owner is waiting for County permitting to address a structural matter. The matter is reported to have been on-going for two years.
18. Information Technology Director met with Seat Pleasant staff regarding Smart City of Excellence Smart City Partnership. Seat Pleasant has asked for initial support on a multi-jurisdictional effort. However, this appears to be a different set of municipalities than those participating in the University effort. No letter has been set as this is further explored.
19. Staff submitted an application to the Bullet Proof Vest Partnership.
20. In follow-up to Councilmember Pope's question, Public Works contacted WSSC regarding the sinkhole on Westway.
21. Attended the City Council Regular Meeting, Council Work Session on the Dog Park, and a Closed Session regarding Legal Consultation and Personnel Matters.
22. Scheduled to attend Greenbelt Day Weekend activities.
23. Assistant City Manager
  - a. Along with City Manager and City Treasurer, worked on Budget Ordinance and adoption memo.
  - b. Finalized logistics for Naturalization Ceremony and prepared for other Greenbelt Day events.
  - c. Distributed Peace Month flyers.



*The following items highlight the various activities of the staff of Planning and Community Development for the past week.*

### **CODE ENFORCEMENT**

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**Commercial Properties:** Roosevelt Center, 7474 Greenway Center Drive Maryland Trade Center II, 6905 Greenbelt Road Holy Cross Lutheran Church, 7500 Greenway Center Drive Maryland Trade Center I, and 7800 Good Luck Road Trinity Assembly of God Church were re-inspected.

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**Apartments:** Glen Oaks Apartments were annually inspected.

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**Rental Property:** Seven rentals were annually inspected; and  
Four rentals were re-inspected.

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**Complaints:** One new complaint was logged regarding a sump pump dislodging water, ponding/standing water, and mosquitoes in Greenwood Village; and  
One prior complaint was re-inspected in Franklin Park.

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**Permits:** Twenty-five permits were approved and issued.

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**Windshields:** Greenwood Village – Mandan Road was observed.
