City Manager's Report Week Ending October 4, 2019

- 1. Attached please find a confidential memo on personnel and legal matters.
- 2. As of the date of this report, staff anticipates that the State will require the City to lower the Greenbelt Lake water level again for the Greenbelt Lake Dam Project. Also anticipated is additional work and expense. While staff confirms the required work with the State, Ms. Terry Hruby, Planning Director, continues to work with an environmental consultant (Environmental Systems Analysis) on proactively addressing impacts to animals and plants. This may include the installation of an aerator next week.

The project cannot move forward until the Lake is lowered again and other activities suggested by the State completed. As noted last week, the contractor is near finished with available work given current circumstances. Staff will review the potential next phases for work that may start in order to reduce the financial impact of stopping work.

An upcoming race may be rerouted to address the work. As noted previously, the Thanksgiving Day Gobble Wobble will be rerouted elsewhere.

- 3. Participated via phone in a University of Maryland Smart Cities Coalition meeting on autonomous vehicle technology in Maryland and Prince George's County.
- 4. As of mid-day on the date of this report, 56 people had applied to the Green Ridge House Apartments waiting list.
- 5. As of the afternoon of this report, staff received a walk-in inquiry from a couple denied entry to a local residential rental community to go door to door to register youth to vote. The couple was not denied entry by the City. The City Code does not require a permit to go door to door to register people to vote. The City is researching if there is a permit that could help the couple gain entry to the private property (Hawkers, etc.). However, the alternative provided was to identify a public location to register people.
- 6. Voter registration forms will be made available at Springhill Lake Recreation Center this weekend.
- 7. Reviewed two police candidate applications. The new candidates will proceed to the police academy.
- 8. GHI has prepared a survey on pathway lighting as requested by Council.
