

The Greenbelt Forest Preserve



“A protected, undeveloped, and undisturbed area for the benefit of current and future generations.”

The **Greenbelt Forest Preserve** was established in 2003 and consists of nearly 200 wooded acres owned by the City of Greenbelt. Different from a park, play area, or other green area in Greenbelt, the Forest Preserve requires visitors to take extra care and show personal stewardship when enjoying the woods.

In the Greenbelt Forest Preserve, visitors **MAY**...

- Roam on established trails, cross streams, and ramble over logs.
- Explore and photograph the plants and animals.
- Walk their leashed pets.
- Participate in educational and other approved programs.
- Enjoy the forest in its untouched condition.

In the Greenbelt Forest Preserve, visitors **MAY NOT**...

- Dump anything, including yard waste like leaves. (Yard waste is picked up by the Greenbelt Public Works Department at no cost).
- Clear or maintain trails.
- Ride bicycles or motor vehicles.
- Camp, cook, or light fires.
- Harm or disturb any animal or plant life.
